

REPORTING TO PARENTS POLICY - NAG 1

Objective

Learning partnerships strengthen parents' understanding and involvement in their child's education. Effective learning partnerships can have positive impacts on student outcomes.

Purposes

- 1. To inform parents of children's
 - o achievement data
 - key competencies and social skills
 - strengths and next steps
- 2. To establish targets with families in literacy and numeracy based on current achievement data.
- To report in writing twice a year to parents, families and whanau about their child's progress and achievement in reading, writing and maths in relation to Marshall Laing Primary School curriculum expectations.
- 4. To report to the community on the school-wide progress and achievement in relation to the Marshall Laing Primary School curriculum expectations.

Guidelines

1. Student progress will be reported formally to parents by:

- An individual parent/teacher/student conference, scheduled bi-annually.
 At the conference teachers will share the student's current achievement and learning targets. These will be student-led where possible.
- The written reports will tell parents if their child is working at the expected year level, or if they are working at a level above or below the expected standard.
- A written summary of achievements and progress will be sent home bi-annually.
- 2. All reporting will be based on evidence and will be objective and constructive.
- 3. Teachers who have concerns over the child's learning will arrange for parents to come into school to discuss improving outcomes for the child.
- 4. Our school will continue to operate an "open door" policy and parents are free to discuss any matter with the Principal or classroom teachers at an agreed time.
- 5. Parents will be able to access a parent portal on our School Management System (SMS) where they will be able to view their tamariki portfolio.
